

Florida 2011 Leader Requirements:

The following must be completed between August 1, 2010 and June 20, 2011 to qualify for the 2011 Florida Trip

Required:

1. Put in eight hours of fundraising for the troop
2. Have a full class A uniform (shirt, long pants & belt or shirt, shorts, scout socks & belt)
3. Two or more hours of community service
4. Attend seven (7) of the nine (9) campouts (between Aug 2010 and May 2011)
5. Have Youth Protection Certification
6. Complete training on Safe Swim Defense
7. Complete training on Safety Afloat
8. Be able to drive on the Florida trip (with proper insurance*)

Do nine (9) of the following:

1. Earn the Polar Bear Award
2. Serve ACTIVELY with the Troop for six months
3. Help scouts with collection of 2011 Pipestone wood'
4. Help lead a program at a troop meeting
5. Community service hours (three (3) hours over and above the two (2) required)
6. Attend a work day at the garage (for clean-up)
7. Assist on a Webelos campout
8. Attend Scout Sunday
9. Assist on an Eagle Scout project
10. Enter the Church of the Cross Chili Cook-off on Sept 18, 2010
11. Attend one religious service at a church, synagogue, or mosque of your choice (Scout Sunday excluded)
12. Complete Basic First Aid and CPR Training
13. Attend five (5) Troop 68 committee meetings

*BSA Policy: All vehicles MUST be covered by a public liability and property damage liability insurance policy. The amount of this coverage must meet or exceed the insurance requirements of the state in which the vehicle is licensed. (It is recommended, however, that coverage limits are at least \$50,000/\$100,000/50,000 or \$100,000 combined single limit.) Any vehicle carrying 10 or more passengers is required to have limit of \$100,000/\$500,000/\$100,000 or \$500,000 combined single limit. In case of rented vehicles, the requirement of coverage can be met by combining the limits of personal coverage carried by the driver with coverage carried by the owner of the vehicle.
